- 28th July 29th July A48 Flaxley junction to Blaisdon junction. Railway bridge maintenance
- 4th August 8th August Grange road, (between Littledean and Soudley) -renewing gully frame.
- 26th August 28th August Awre: Junction with Branches Road A48. new gully covers.
- 20th 23rd August. Mallards Pike to Blakeney Straights drain jetting and maintenance
- 9th 16th September Carriage way resurfacing in and around Oakwood Road Bream

It has been a year since Fix my Streets was introduced as a tool for us all to report issues with our roads and footpaths.

Local Government Reorganisation (LGR)

- 1. Gloucestershire becomes one unitary authority
- 2. Gloucestershire becomes two unitary authorities, east would be Tewksbury, Cheltenham and Cotswold, west would be Forest of Dean, Gloucester and Stroud

Between now and November a firm proposal (or two) needs to be worked up and presented to government at which point the government will decide which one we will adopt. Levels and how wider consultation will take place will probably be decided after elections in May.

I have been confirmed on to Committees – Planning and Adult Social Care & Communities.

I have been doing more training and attending meetings and meetings booked – highways, public transport.

We are looking at setting up a regular meeting with all 8 of the CCs in order to share info and work together on issues that affect multiple areas.

I am trying to get more information and engagement from some services – Traffic Enforcement, Highways to try and ensure we are getting our fair share of resources.

I am awaiting a meeting with the local police to see how we can work more closely together.

I have started meeting with residents and business owners to take more of a deep dive to understand the issues we face more clearly in the area, in particular crime, ASB. This may take some time, but I think it will be useful.

My colleague Stuart is leading on issues around schools and football pitches at the moment and can update you. We are planning to visit SGS when the Head Teacher replies.
